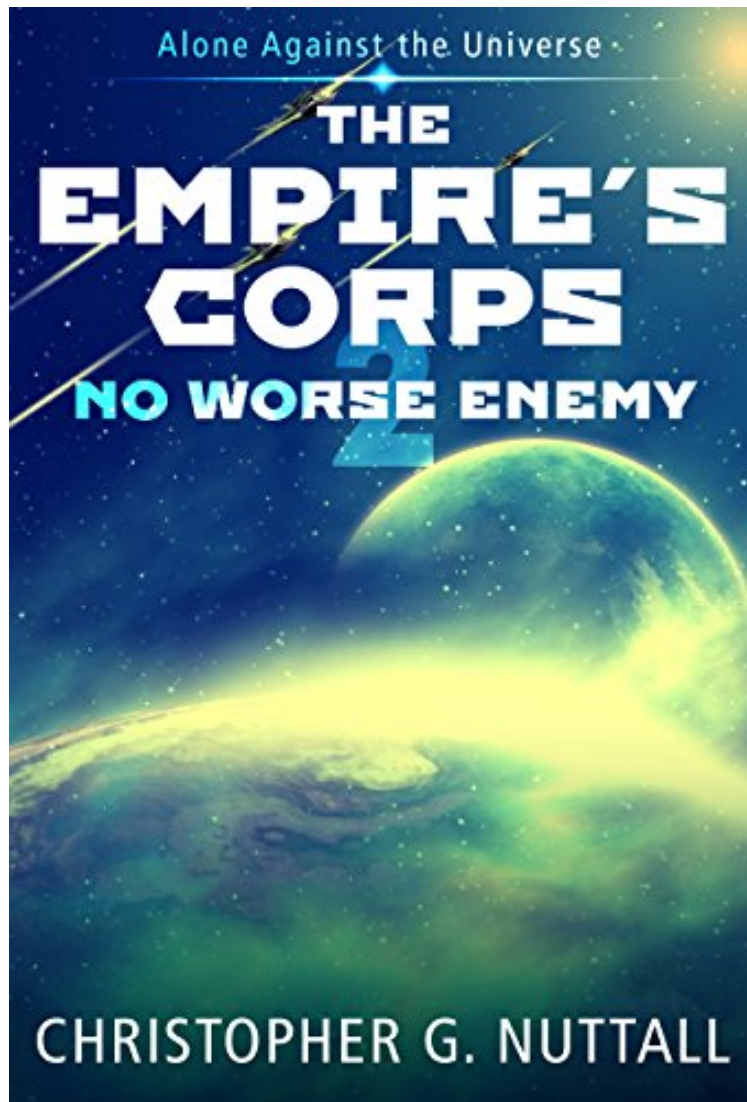

It picks up seamlessly after the first installment and continues to tell the story of the Stalker's Stalkers Terran Marines.The writing style is very immersive, several times I was quite unable to put down the book, because I wanted to know how a particular scene

would unfold. The main characters all develop further and mature under duress. And duress they have: This time the action doesn't play out on a planet but in space. We see less Marine close quarter fighting and a bit more strategic action instead. So there as well the story evolves and doesn't repeat brainlessly the first part. Very enjoyable. Now if you look at my header for this review you will see "mature": As with the first part, this book contains very graphic scenes of violence and sex. Persons are tortured, raped, put under drugs, killed in gruesome manner and more. While this can be had in many military scifi novels the author combines it with some very questionable moral lessons regarding how lawful persons should deal with criminals and what kind of actions are allowed to upkeep law and order. It reads partly a bit like propaganda for a militaristic state form. So this is definitely not a read for a twelve year old.
