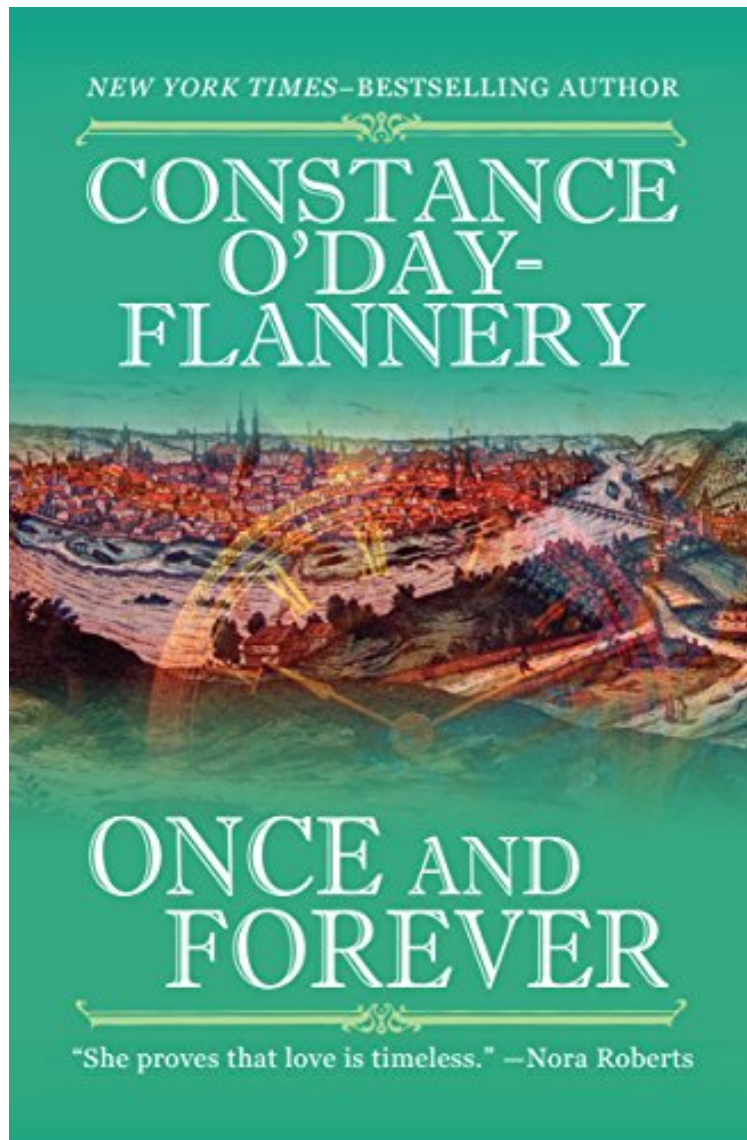

Good point: search of twin souls and soul mates. The author speaks about the male/female forces of the universe and of the human race having to find their balance. How better to accomplish this than by BEING a male in one life and a female in another? Seems logical enough but was not mentioned. The author tried too hart to mix philosophical and religious beliefs with a romance and unfortunately butchered both. O'Day's earlier time-travel romances were much better.
