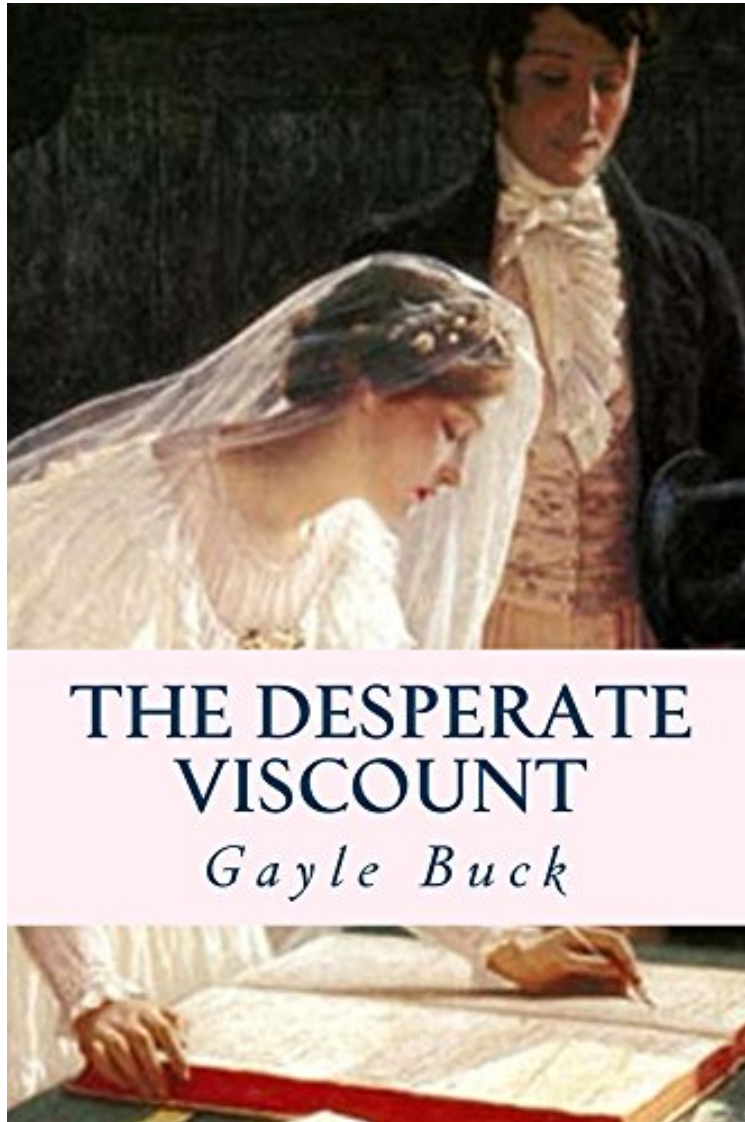

quite uninteresting and the hero quite a simpleton. Ok, he is described as a superhero. He knows 100.000 different sports AND he likes to study (or did like it in school) and is intelligent and he is a gentleman and perfectly polite. At least, that is what the author tells us. That wouldn't bother me, I don't expect romance novels to be realistic or have a little bit tempered characters. But if the hero is so intelligent and (icily) polite than why can't he behave that way???

SPOILERFor example, after he has lost his chances to inherit a fortune and has no respectable income of his own, he is absolutely surprised that his fiancée wants to end their engagement, although he is aware that their understanding is not founded on any kind of softer feelings. Why is he surprised? Does he think she wants to be poor, if she can choose otherwise? They don't believe each other in love. So why shouldn't she end their engagement? And then, he needs his friends to point out to him, that he might rescue himself by choosing a wealthy bride. Well, I don't know, but the hero doesn't seem to shine with such high intellect. For the hero it's all about keeping up appearance - and doing nothing (except, when his friends urge him into action). And the reader should admire him for that. Well, if the hero would be witty or a little bit self-critical (because he has spend more money than he had for years) than I might find the hero or the story a little bit more entertaining... But since he is not, i will stop reading now after 1/3 of the book. P.S. And the hero is not polite - not icily and not otherwise. So why does the author tells us that he is? Make him rude - for heavens sake!
