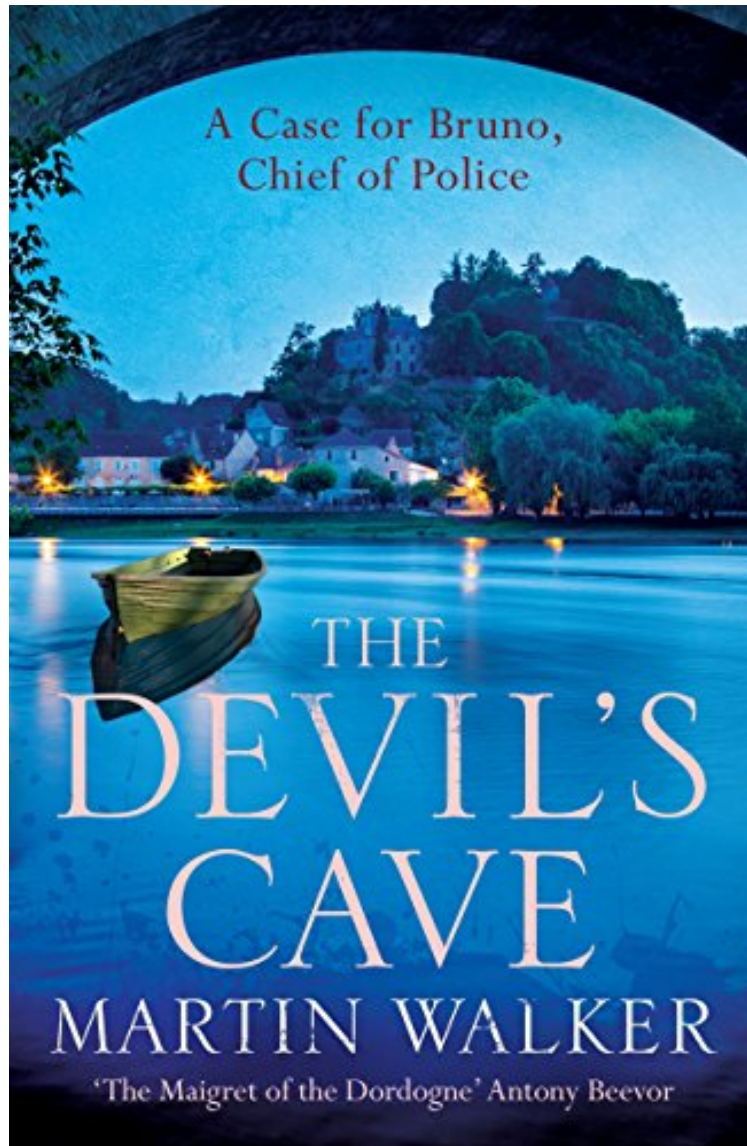

A boat is floating on the Vezre, with a naked woman inside, who is obviously dead or seriously injured. To get the boat out of the river is tricky, and then it turns out that the woman is dead and a victim of a satanic ritual. But this is not the only exciting event in St. Denis. A highly controversial construction project is planned to bring more tourists to St. Denis, and Bruno has to cope with obscure financial transactions and arms industry lobbyists. In between Bruno tries to relax by cooking and caring for his animals, but gets distracted by the two women in his life and his romantic feelings. The story is told quietly and without much blood. It is a good and relaxing read, although the worldwide political and social problems do not spare a quiet town like St. Denis. To read a Bruno-novel is like a trip to friends. All the characters we like from the earlier volumes are met again in this book. Especially Bruno catches my heart more and more. I appreciate how he struggles for others and how he tries to find a for everyone acceptable solution without using the full force of the laws. What I love most in this character is his ability to savour the good things in his life, like the homemade food he got stored or prepares freshly. That in addition to his animals, his garden and his quiet character makes him so attractive that I am not surprised about his success with women.
