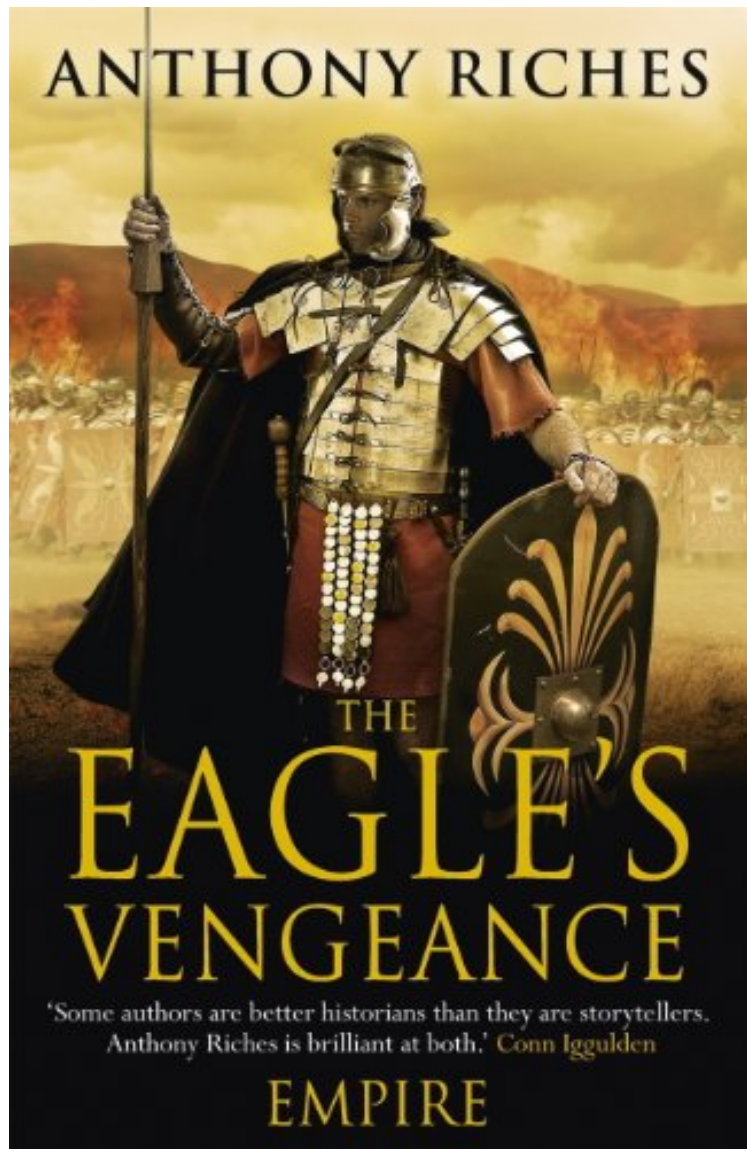

Die Tungerer haben ihren Ausflug nach Dacia hinter sich. Einige Wochen nach der Niederschlagung des Aufstandes und der Rettung des Goldes sind sie wieder auf dem nach Britannien, um dort etwas zur Ruhe zu kommen. Doch weit gefehlt. Die in Britannien ansässigen Legionen wurden in den Norden entsendet, um dort den Antonius Wall zu besetzen. Aus einer Laune heraus setzt der Imperator das Führungspersonal der Legionen fest, und befiehlt den Truppen dort zu verweilen, wo sie sich gerade befinden. Und dann tauchen auch noch Gerichte über den Verbleib des verlorengegangenen Adlers der 6. Legion... Band 6 hat mich doch sehr überrascht. Zum einen greift Riches einige lose Enden auf, er bringt die Tungerer zurück auf die Insel, nimmt sich des verlorenen Adlers an, und verrührt das Ganze zu einem wirklich schmackhaften und spannenden Allerlei, das von ein bisschen Intrige, über Scharmtzel, einer Brise Indiana Jones, und den wieder einmal sehr schön vom Autor beschriebenen Schlachten, alles bietet, was man sich als Fan von historischen Bchern wünscht.
