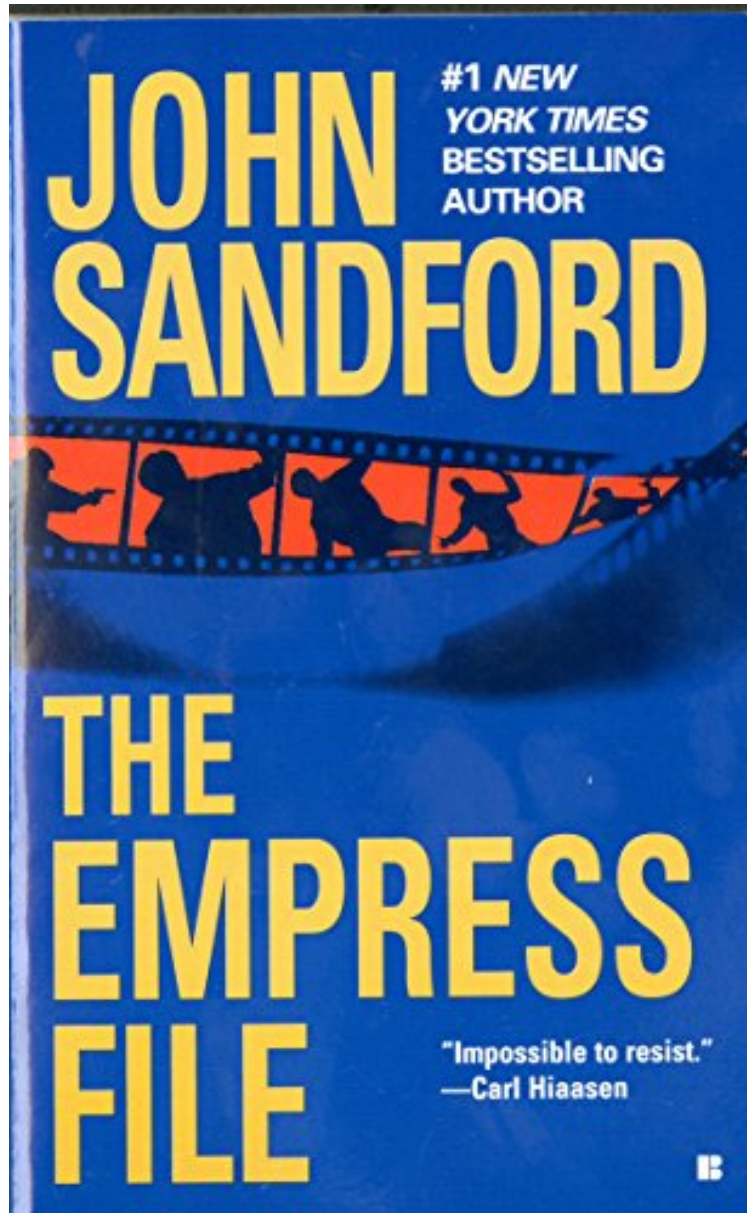

By the end, I felt very unsatisfied and it took me some time to figure it out. I finally realised what was bothering me - the plot is very implausible and the dialogue speeds along at top speed, without going into too much detail or depth. The characters are flimsy, stereotyped and one-dimensional. Plus the ending is very predictable and you can see a mile off who was going to get murdered. This is one of those books you take with you on a long plane flight or when sitting on the beach, read it and then throw it away. The main premise of the story - covertly bringing about the downfall of a corrupt city council in revenge for the police shooting of a black child. This would be a great plot for a book if it was done properly. But Sandford makes it look like any idiot could do it if they had the money and the guns. I would imagine it's not that easy to bring about the downfall of the mayor and her goofy goons in real life. Kidd and LuEllen basically burgle the councillors' houses, steal their money, and all of a sudden, the councillors are freaking out and they have to resign! OK...is it that easy to manipulate a council in the US? At times when reading this book, you think "Yeah right!" when something happens in the book which would never happen normally. I like my books to have a certain degree of realism and this book is sadly lacking in that. 3 stars for this one. This is definitely a "only read it if you're bored" book.
