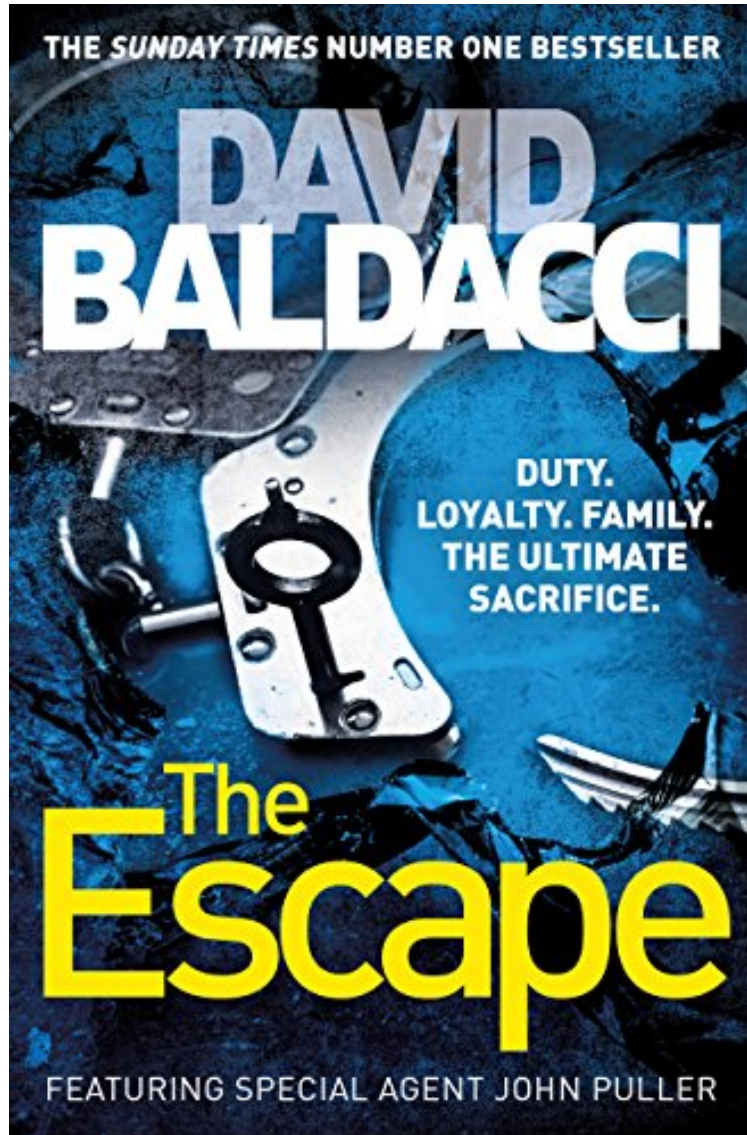

stars up to page 500 and a lot worse after that. I like books which are a bit more complex and detailed and this one certainly is ... multiple layers, some surprises, some uncertainty ... not bad. What's not so good is the human side ... the personalities are simply not consistent, behaviour not adequate to the intelligence (my thesis: an author is not able to convincingly describe a character with an IQ higher than his own (or much lower btw.)) ... I mention page 500 because at that point the reading simply becomes unpleasant because the readers sympathy with the main characters comes in conflict with their behavior ... there's some underlying unnecessary feminist aspect to this book (impossible to describe in a few words) which might have lead to this strange development ... I don't know - the author obviously intended to stretch the unavoidable development between the two main protagonists to the end and so he inserts a totally unbelievable development in order to partially destroy their relation for a spell. Actually throughout the entire book that relation does not feel entirely natural which made reading uncomfortable at times. Well, the whole story is not very believable to begin with, but for the first 500 pages the action carries the reader over the weak spots ... Weak spots ? How about a seasoned investigator who avoids flying in order to stay under the NSA radar but turns out to use his credit cards to pay for his car fuel and ends up surprised that they were able to track him ... or a lady in the hospital which happened to survive a bomb after flying through a shop window ... which is under police protection and can't move her legs etc. ... but happens to have a tracking device handy out of nowhere to drop in her partners pocket just for the hell of it ... and other such nonsense ... After 300 pages I was convinced that I would give 5 stars but it went down from there unfortunately.
