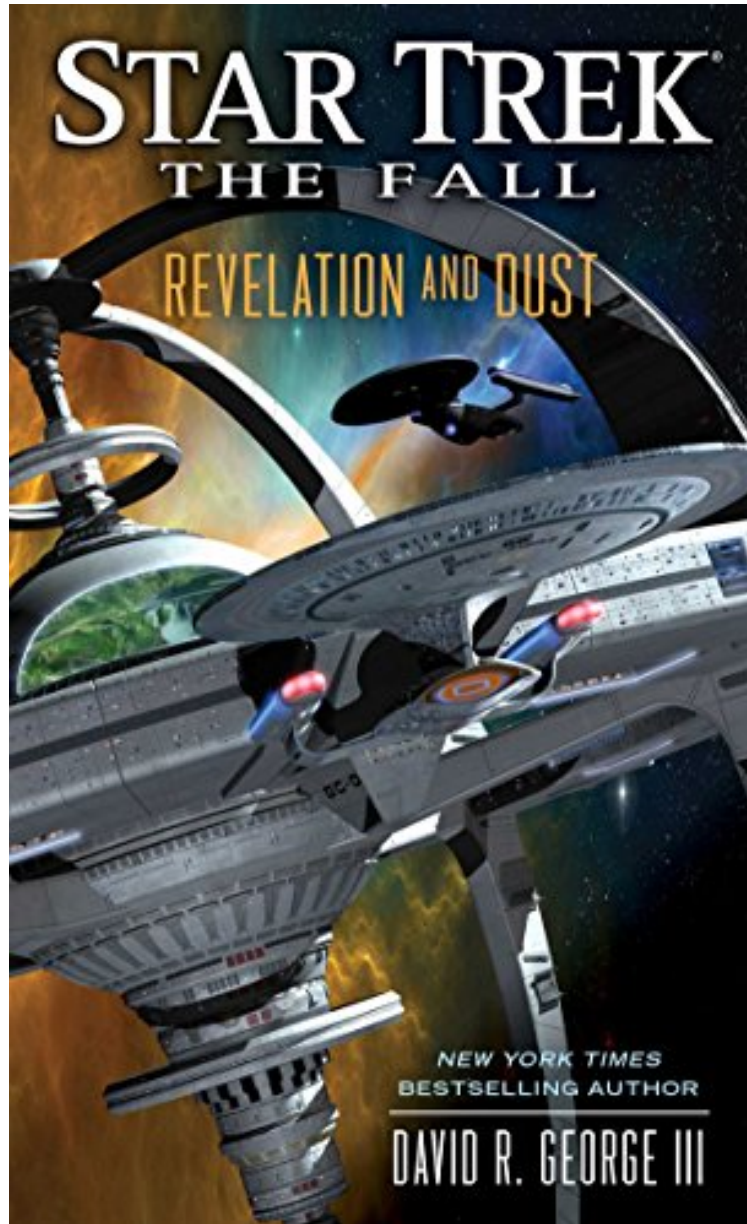

Beide Teilgeschichten laufen parallel und ziehen sich am Anfang etwas hin. Die Story auf Bajor lässt den Leser am Ende des Romans etwas ratlos zurück, aber das ist zu erwarten, da die mysteriösen Propheten (Wurmlochwesen) ihre Finger im Spiel haben ... Die Fortsetzung findet sich dafür in dem DS9-Roman *Sacraments of Fire*, den ich selbst allerdings noch nicht gelesen habe ... Die zweite Story schaut auf die Führungsmannschaft von DS9 wie es die Eröffnungsfeier für die neue Station vorbereitet und auf einige geladenen Staatsgäste, die daran teilnehmen werden. Zum Ende hin wird es sehr spannend, da ein zentraler Charakter der Star Trek-Romanwelt ein grausames Schicksal ereilt und die Folgen dieses Zwischenfalls den Ton für die weiteren Romane der Reihe setzen werden ... Von Markus Helberg After having read the excellent DS9-centric Typhon Pact novels "Plagues of Night" and "Raise the Dawn", I was eager to know how the saga of DS9 would continue. So I was excited when I first heard of "Revelation and Dust", bought the day it was published and immediately started reading it. But sadly, the book stayed behind my expectations in more than one way. 1. When Kira appeared in the novel, I was interested in what would happen to her and expected her return to the station in the end of the novel resulting in an exciting cliffhanger. But her story turned out to be more than boring, starting with the detailed reiteration of Sisko's first encounter with the prophets followed by the story of Keev and her guild. I must confess, I skipped most of those chapters because they failed in generating any interest. 2. On DS9, nothing really happens. Except a series of sad ceremonies. Everyone is still mourning the loss of the old station and the people lost with her. Important dignitaries meet and talk but no progress is made. 3. The only thing that happens is the death of Federation President Nanietta Bacco. Somehow her death reminded me of Tasha Yar. There is nothing indicating a threat to her life, she is shot out of nowhere and even though help is present, she just dies. The investigation into her murder is - again - less than interesting. A culprit is immediately found, the evidence is clear, case closed. Or not, because - to no surprise - it turns out to be plot but nothing comes from it. Altogether, I was very disappointed. The parts of the book I really read are well written but there are better Star Trek novels. 2 von 2 Kunden fanden die folgende Rezension hilfreich. Bergangsroman mit diversen Längen Von Uwe Schoolmann Dieser Roman ist wohl als Bergangsroman zu sehen. Der einzige Grund, warum ich diesem Roman einen zweiten Stern zugestehen will. David R. George III schreibt in einem souveränen Stil eine Zwischengeschichte, die deutliche und unnötige Längen ausweist, wenn sie immer wieder auf Handlungsstränge vorhergegangener Romane verweist. Die zweite, "Kira"-Storyline wirkt zudem störend, da sie es immer wieder "schafft" einen aufkommenden Leserrhythmus des Lesers bei der Hauptstoryline zu unterbrechen. Der Höhepunkt des Romans rettet die träge dahinflutschende Story nicht und hinterlässt beim Leser eine Verwirrung, da er Aussagen aus früheren Bänden widerspricht. Mehr sei an dieser Stelle nicht gesagt, um die ganze Handlung, die in drei Stufen zusammengefasst werden könnte, nicht zu verraten.
