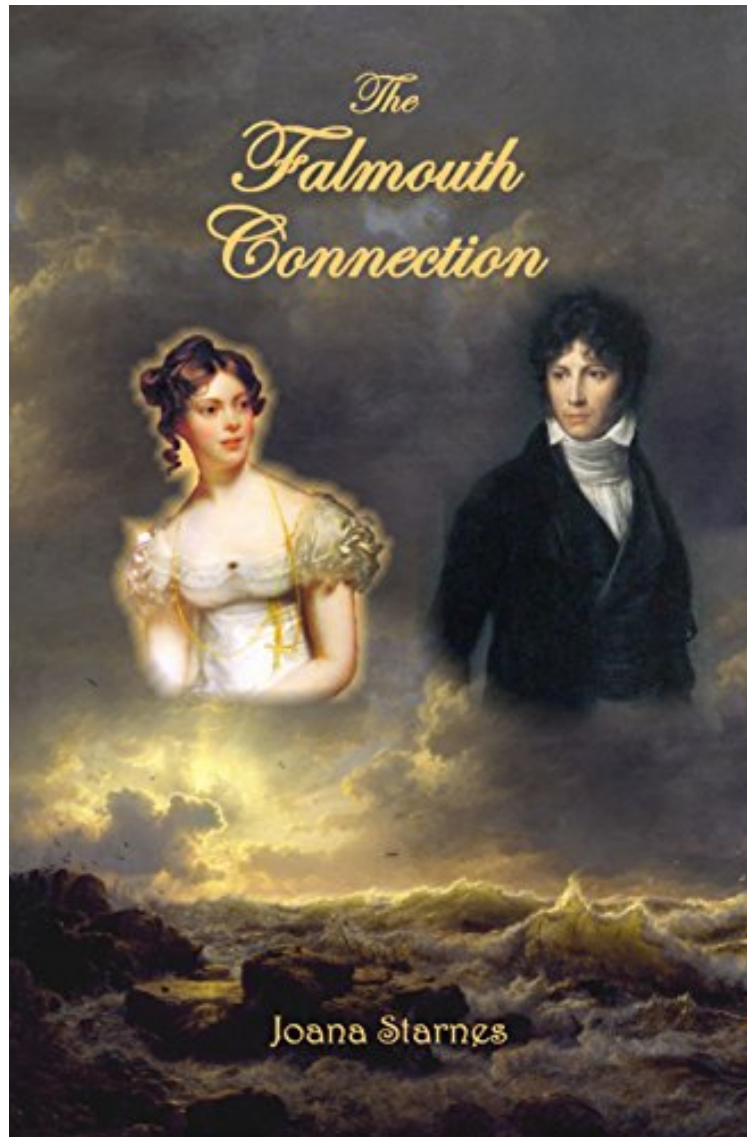

The story is very romantic without giving someone a cavity, exciting and believable. I love how they stay the main characters with the others as support, that's how I prefer a story in this category. +++ Spoiler Alert +++ I'm no great fan of Lydia but here she is bearable, useful actually. And to be honest, after Lizzy, it's her who is the most interesting sister of Lizzy, not Jane. As wild as she is you have room to improve her character and it would be believable if it's well done. I was surprised with whom she was paired and even if she was still too young to marry, in the end I thought why not. She was the best choice from the remaining sisters anyway. Kitty's pairing wasn't believable. The Lord who fell so violently in love with Lizzy wouldn't move on to her sister a few years later. That move just wasn't done well. I don't want to sound mean but Mary and Kitty just don't have the characters to catch someone so interesting and with that standing. They should be paired with males who would fit them, just as Jane Austen did. But as their part was really small it didn't really matter in the end. I was also glad that Georgiana didn't have a role here and only was mentioned through letters. How that minor character got so popular is baffling so I was glad that she was only mentioned. Darcy and Lizzy don't need her to come together and so it should stay. Mrs. Bennet is nicer here though no less annoying so her role was exactly as it should be. The same with Mr. Bennet, he was as he always is. I don't want to write what really happens besides what little I already wrote and I strongly advise you fans to buy this book and to read it. Von Christin I loved the previous Pride and Prejudice crossovers but this is even better. Joana Starnes understands to mingle old and new characters while keeping them in character. In the Falmouth Connection Colonel Fitzwilliam stops Darcy from making his first disastrous proposal and accompanies Elizabeth to Cornwall. At first it seems like Darcy is able to alter Elizabeth's opinion but the same obstacles in a different setting. Joana Starnes makes us understand how Darcy came to his wrong conclusions and how much he suffers while trying to win Elizabeth's affection. He follows her to Falmouth where he is met with new circumstances thanks to Elizabeth's great-aunt. He and Bingley try to redeem themselves. Through several fast-paced events they show their worth and win their objects affection and succeed. I loved how Joana made Bingley grow a backbone, Mr. Bennet see how his behaviour led to his younger daughters current behaviour and even Mrs Bennet is trying to do the best for her daughters. The setting in Cornwall sounds beautiful and fits into the new and original plot perfectly. Joana manages to make both Elizabeth and Mr. Darcy grow and let both see why they are perfect for each other. I was very surprised at the Lydia/Colonel Fitzwilliam match. I've never read about them as a couple before. I've always liked him and Lydia never came to mind but somehow it works. Well done. All in all a very good Pride and Prejudice variation. I highly recommend it.
