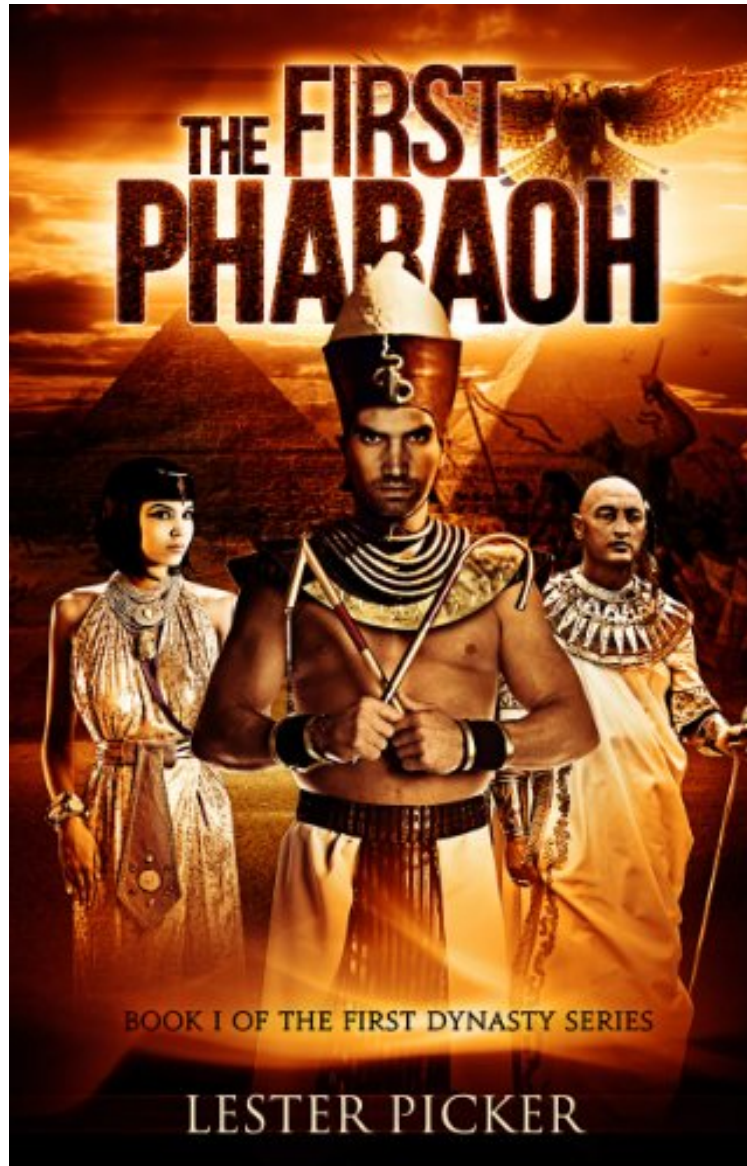

fr mich auch an der Geschichte, an einigen Stellen fand ich es etwas langwierig (daher kommen auch meine 4 Sterne). Man kann nicht wirklich sagen, wie historisch getreu das Buch ist, das gibt der Autor auch selber zu. Aus der Zeit von Narmer haben wir halt nur wenige Informationen, viele Ereignisse werden nur teilweise ber liefert. Aus dieser Tatsache kann aber der Autor schon viel rausholen und man merkt, dass er viel recherchiert hat und sich mit dem Thema vertraut gemacht hat. Er beschreibt auch einige Gegenstnde ziemlich genau ( z.B. die Palette ber die Vereinigung von Unter- und Obergypten), so dass man davon ausgehen kann, dass diese Gegenstnde bei den Ausgrabungen gefunden wurden und sie dem Autor bekannt sind. Da scheint der Autor ziemlich akkurat zu sein. Durch die Lage der Quellen kann man aber davor ausgehen, dass die Mehrheit der Gesprche und Handlungen ausgedacht ist. Fr mich war der Stil des Autors etwas langwierig, ich konnte mich durch einige Szenen nur mit etwas Mhe durchlesen, was mir den Genuss etwas geschmlert hat.
