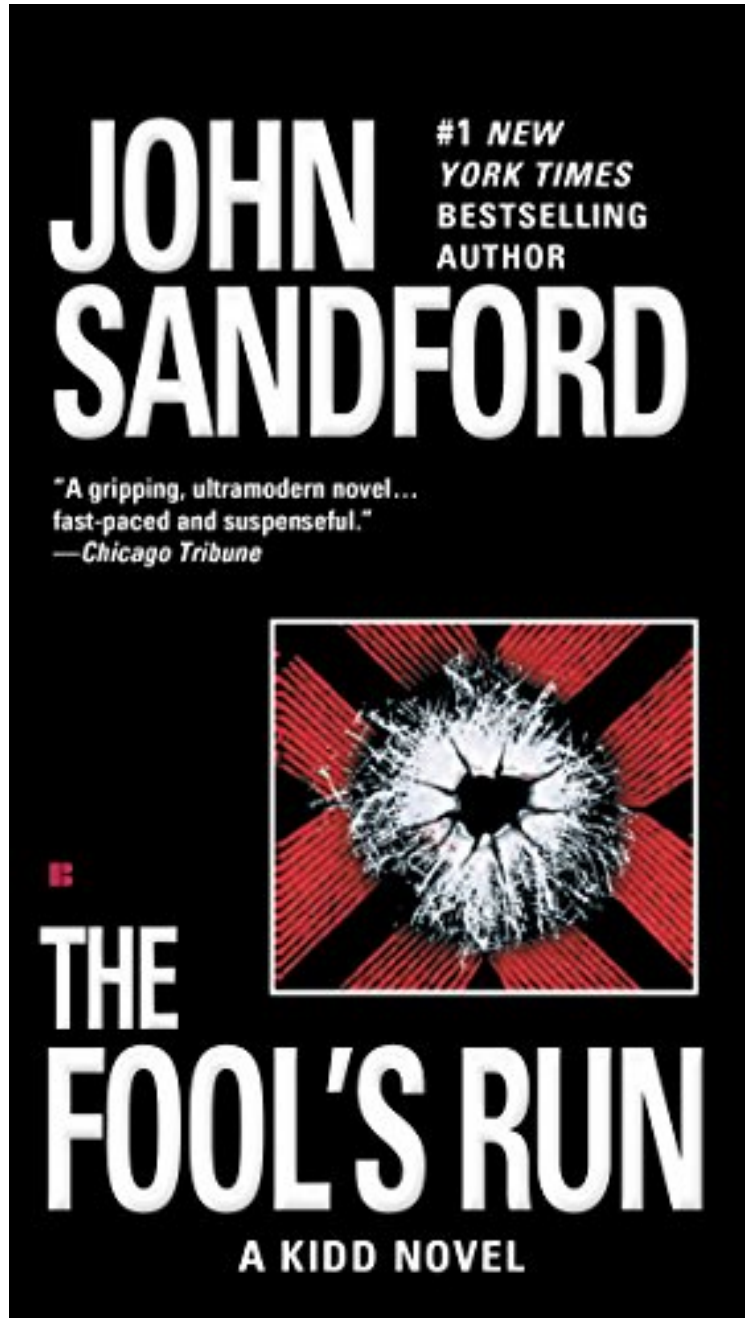

But the book is ludicrous! After planting a few computer viruses, the company collapses, army generals are arrested for corruption....is it so easy to destroy a US defence company? I don't think so. Are US systems programmers so stupid that they can't spot a virus and trace it to its source?
