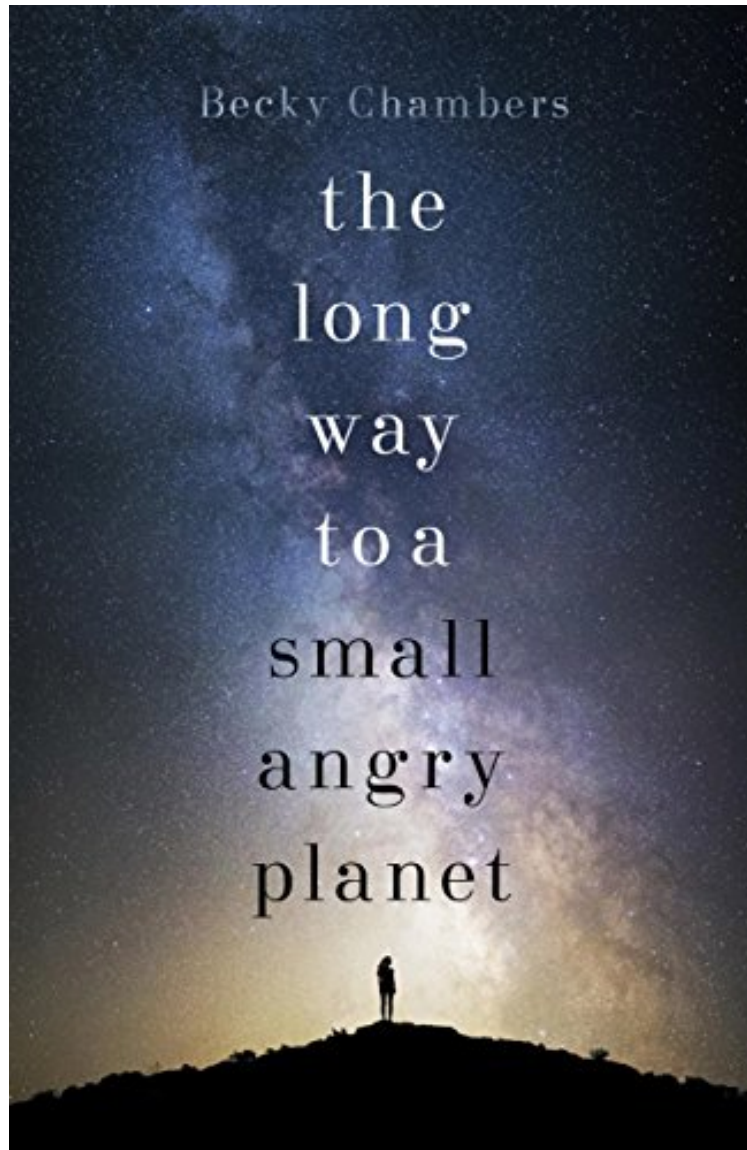

The characters are very well described and within the first pages the reader becomes entangled in the story of Rosemary and the crew around Captain Ashby. There is a story behind every character that is carefully woven into the plot, which gives the reader the opportunity to ponder about humanity and what truly matters in life. As the Wayfarer is building a hyperspace tunnel to a small, "angry" planet, the crew is drawn into an interplanetary conflict and the complicated politics of space travel, which are depicted in a realistic and authentic way, and even though there are no huge galactic space battles, the plot never becomes boring. Mostly, this is a book about friendship, love and everyday life in the vast openness of space, and it reminded me of one of the better Star Trek Next generation episodes.
