Die Geschichte beschreibt anhand des Logbuchs von Mark Watney den (eigentlich aussichtslosen) berlebenskampf auf dem Mars. Zurckgeblieben mit einem Habitat, das fr einen 30-tgigen Aufenthalt vorgesehen ist, und ohne funktionierende Kommunikationseinrichtungen versucht Watney, Kontakt zur Erde aufzunehmen und seine Nahrungsvorrte durch Kartoffelanbau aufzustocken.
