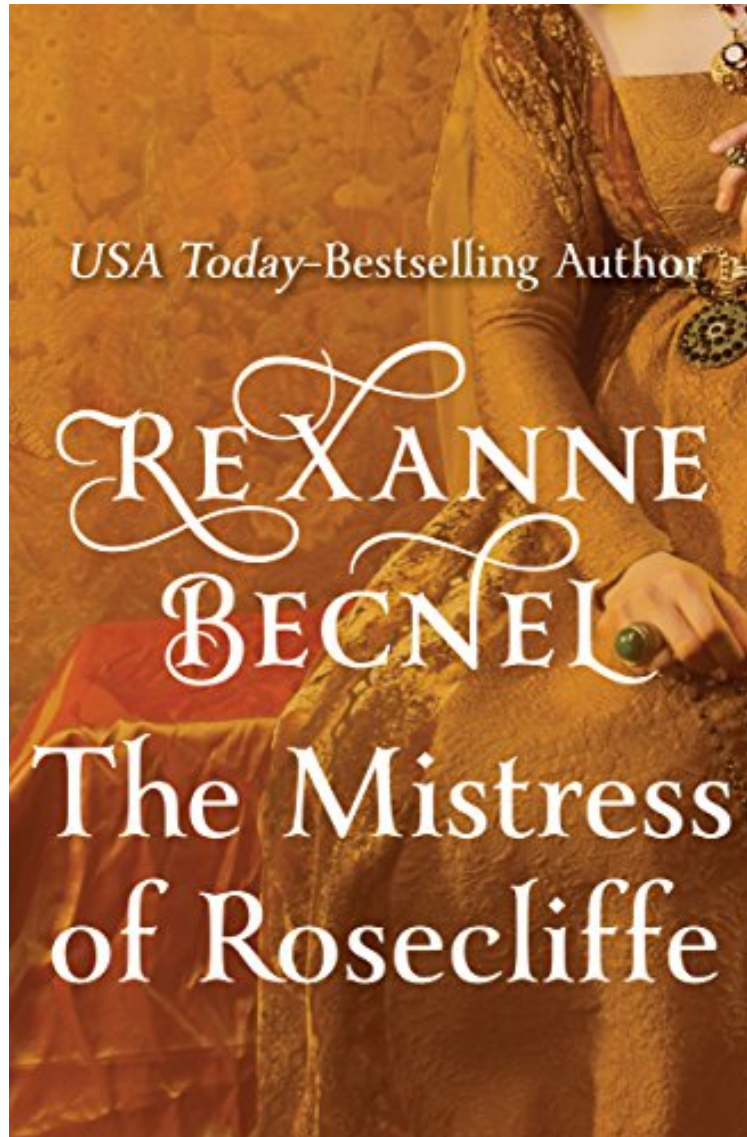

To her amazement, she finds herself falling in love with her family's sworn enemy. Though her father has promised her to some London nobleman, Isolde wants Rhys. However, years of mistrust and ethnic hatred make any permanent relationship seem not only remote, but also down right dangerous. THE MISTRESS OF ROSECLIFFE, the third tale the "Rosecliffe" trilogy (see THE BRIDE OF ROSECLIFFE and THE KNIGHT OF ROSECLIFFE) is a stirring medieval romance. The story line is exciting, filled with non-stop action and romance, and tidbits from history. The lead couple is dynamic as they struggle between their heritage and their love. No one but a ruthless, unredeemable character like Rhys, (although at some point in the book, we're told he's really a good man) could stomach a spoiled, immature woman like Isolde. Aside from having some artistic ability, she mostly cries, bemoans her wanton lack of morals, is rude to the servants and screams at Rhys. Oh, yeah. This reviewer forgot. When a man and woman constantly yell that they hate each others guts, it's called Romantic Conflict. With these despicable characters (not to be confused with a hero and heroine) at the center of the story, the plot is immaterial, and the conclusion is a who-cares. It also doesn't matter if the medieval setting was accurate. This reviewer was forced into scan mode much of the time and groaned in agony the rest. He is her familys most treacherous foe. Banished from his homeland and forced to learn the hated English ways, Rhys ap Owain has waited twenty years to set foot on Welsh soil again. Taking the innocence of his enemys daughter will strike a mortal blow to the traitorous FitzHughs and be the first step toward avenging his murdered father. Isolde will be the instrument of his retribution, his hostage in the kingdom that was stolen from his people but he never dreams that she will awaken within him a love more powerful than hate.
