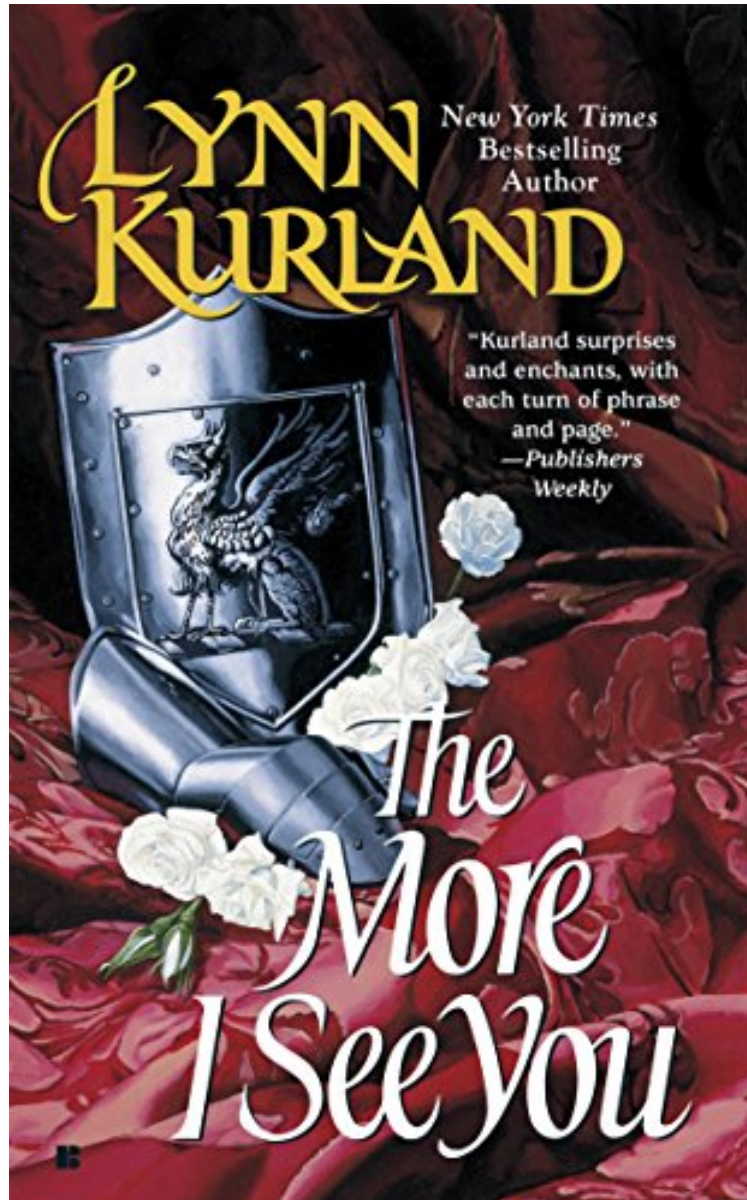

humor. While the writing is somewhat pedestrian and there is little character development, the story can carry the day, despite some of the historical detail being a bit questionable. The reader need only suspend disbelief to get some enjoyment out of this whimsical book. When Jessica Blakely, a modern day miss, finds herself mysteriously transported in time to thirteenth century England, little did she know that it would be there that she would meet the man who was to be the love of her life, Richard De Galtres. He is a noble knight who has hardened his heart against love due to his harsh upbringing by a brutal father, until fate conspires to have Richard and Jessica meet and fall in love. I thought the time travel theory was a little farfetched, but hey, it's supposed to be I guess. I loved the heroine, Jessica Blakely in this novel. I must admit that at first she kind of annoyed me, but by the end of the book I was wishing for more of her sharp wit and commentary. I also loved the hero, Richard. He was the perfect match for Jessica, and it was great fun to see their romance evolve into something wonderful. I like the fact that these two characters grew within the novel and changed into better people. Jessica wasn't as reliant on material things and was more self sufficient and stronger than when the book began. I tended to skip the parts when Richard's brother Hugh was taking over the chapter. Her wish is granted as the 1999 composer is transported back to 1260 England where she meets a bitter Richard of Burwyck-on-the-Sea. At first, Jessica wants to go home, but soon falls in love with her host. Surprisingly, Richard reciprocates. When she is nearly killed, a distraught Richard marries his Jessica even as he cauterizes her dangerous wound. However, when the King threatens Richard's estate, Jessica, willing to do anything for her beloved, wishes to return to the twentieth century so he can marry the king's choice. Her wish is granted, but now she regrets her impetuous action and wants to return. An American in Medieval England is an entertaining time travel romance that will be enjoyed by fans of the sub-genre. The story line is fast-paced and brings to life the intrigue of the era. Jessica is a warm character, though her adjustment to the past seems too easy even if a previous traveler helps her accept it. The fact that Jessica is far, far from Manhattan takes only a little while to sink in, as does the realization that this bold, brash knight is the man for her. But for Richard, whose own dreams of happiness were beaten out of him as a child, it takes a little longer to accept that Jessica is the mate that fate and time have sent him. But even if Jessica wants to stay in 1260 England with her battle-hardened knight, will the forces that drew her to him across time allow her to remain? And if Richard gives his wary heart into Jessica's keeping, can he be sure she won't carry it away with her into the future and leave him alone? Kurland has a talent for mixing the pageantry of medieval England and the romance of knightly chivalry with the gritty reality of everyday life.
